Below are some basic guidelines for using the pPB vectors for protein production: 1. The pPB vectors are designed to be used with E. coli strains that are DE3 lysogens i.e. host E. coli cell has a source of T7 RNA polymerase. 2. Recombinant protein induction is usually done at OD600 of 0.6-1.2 using Isopropyl B thiogalactopyranoside (IPTG) at a final concentration of 0.05 -1mM. 3. The ideal concentration of IPTG must be determined empirically for each recombinand protein/cell-line. Similarly, the length of time and temperature for induction provide othe variables that need to be optimized on a case-to-case basis. 4. For toxic proteins, it is recommended to go for shorter induction time and also to try suppress basal recombinant gene expression through (a) addition of glucose or use of plasmid. Please note that special cell-lines are also available in the market that cater to expression of toxic proteins. 5.
